Figure 1 shows the “Edit Access” interface when all the additional joinable site settings are disabled via sakai.properties. The site being shown has never selected any of these settings previously (before it was disabled globally), so the maintainer has no indication that these additional options even exist.

Figure 2 shows the “Edit Access” interface when all the additional joinable site settings are enabled via sakai.properties. The site being shown has never selected any of these settings previously, so obviously none of the settings are checked.

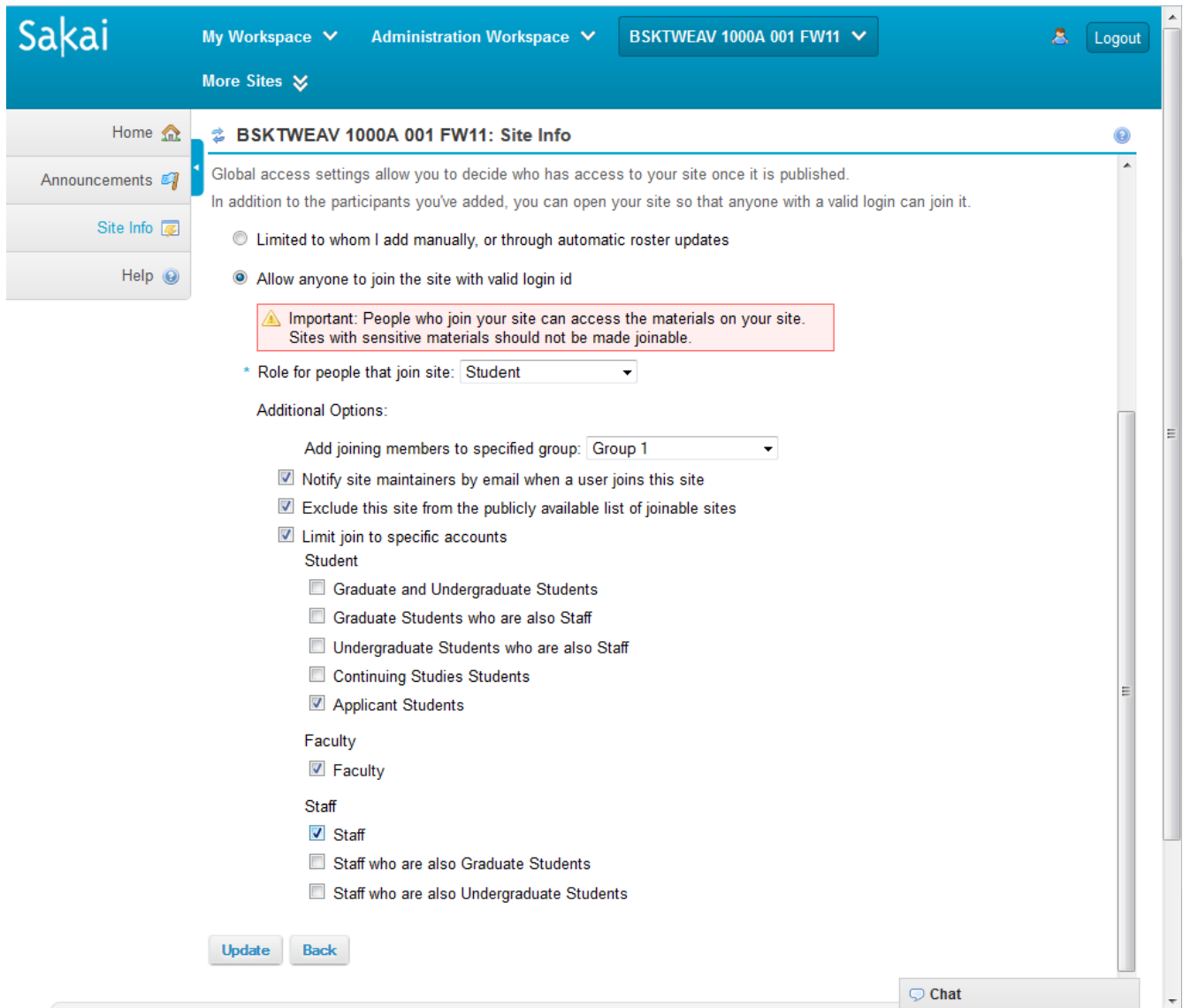


Figure 3 - All settings enabled, with previous selections

Figure 3 shows the “Edit Access” interface when all the additional joinable site settings are enabled via sakai.properties. The site being shown has previously selected some of these settings, so those choices are presented to the maintainer. The account types, labels and categories shown are defined in sakai.properties.

NOTE: the account types used for these screenshots are specific to Western University, we chose to include them in the screenshots rather than the default account types to illustrate the flexibility of the feature.

Global Access

Figure 4 - All settings disabled globally, but enabled locally

Figure 4 shows the “Edit Access” interface when all the additional joinable site settings are disabled via sakai.properties, but the maintainer of the site being shown has previously selected some of these settings. Those choices are presented to the maintainer to remind them of their previous selections, but the checkboxes are disabled so they are unable to modify their selections.

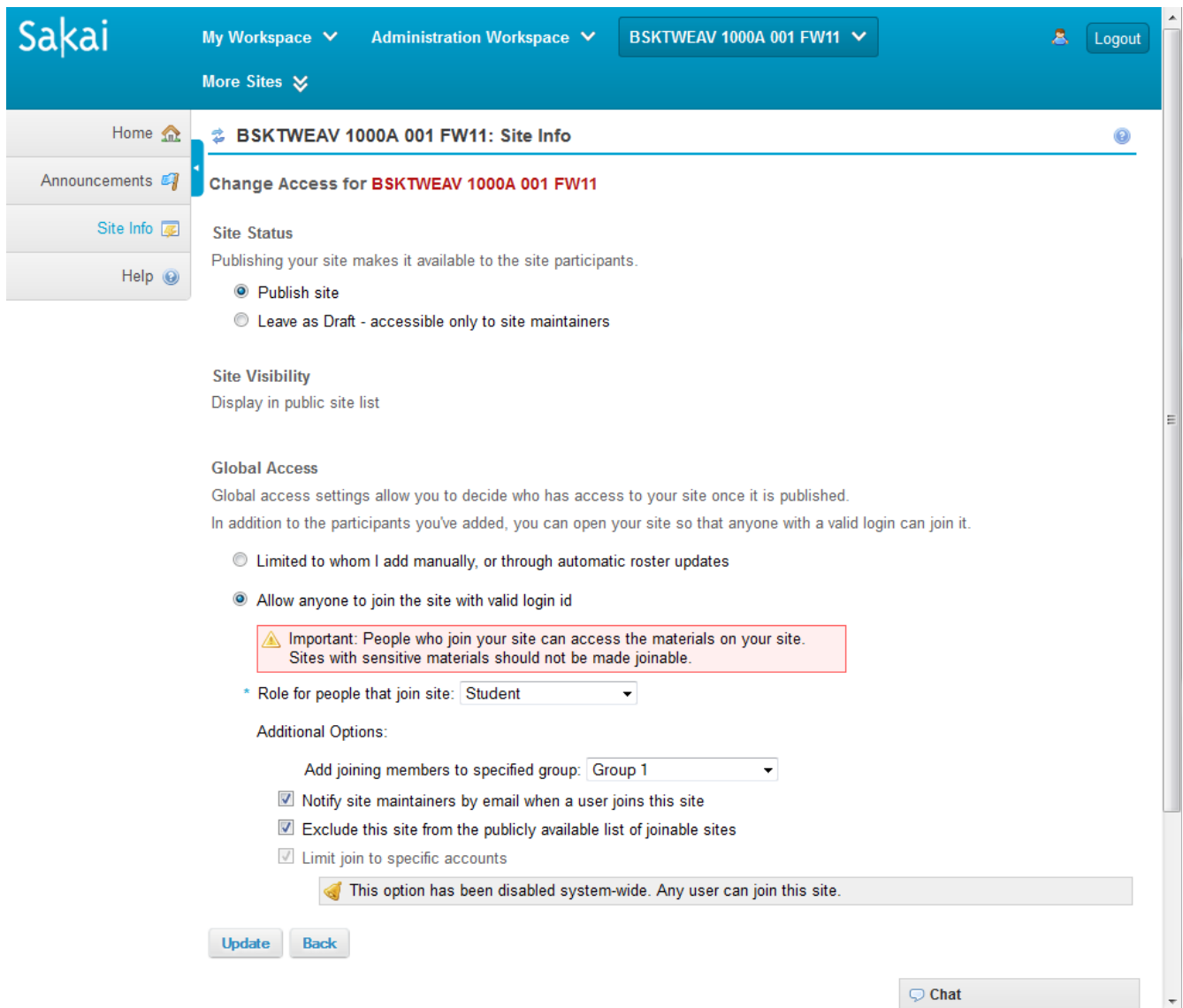


Illustration 1: Figure 5 - all settings disabled globally, enabled locally, but sakai.properties are invalid

Figure 5 shows the “Edit Access” interface when all the additional joinable site settings are disabled via `sakai.properties`, but the maintainer of the site being shown has previously selected some of these settings. However, the `sakai.properties` defining the account type lists are invalid, so rendering these checkboxes is impossible. Therefore, they are shown that it was previously selected, but their choices for the account types are not shown. All checkboxes are disabled.
